### PORTRABLE TREE STANDS MUST BE REMOVED FROM COUNTY MANAGED LANDS

Crow Wing County Land Services is reminding hunters that all portable tree stands or free standing stands must be removed from County managed public lands on or before January 1, 2020.

The Crow Wing County Hunting Stand Ordinance states that portable tree stands must be removed no later than one day following the close of Minnesota's big game hunting season, which will end on December 31, 2019. Permanent hunting stands are also prohibited by the ordinance.

Portable tree stands or portable free-standing stands not removed from County managed public lands are considered abandoned personal property and will be removed pursuant to MN Statute 345.15 and the Crow Wing County Hunting Stand Ordinance.
