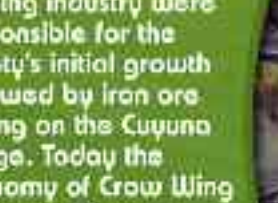

Contrary to common perception, Crow Wing County is not the northern part of the state; it is almost the geographic center of Minnesota. People can travel to the county from Rochester, Worthington, Roseau, or Ely in four hours and fromergus Falls, Duluth and the Twin Cities in two hours.

The county is at the southern edge of the northern boreal forests or the pinecods of North America. Today's white and Norway pines can only give visitors a hint of what it was like to traverse the forests of Crow Wing County and northern Minnesota before the lumber industry cleared the forests. American Indians once knew what this country looked liked. Humans have lived in Crow Wing County for at least 6,000 years. The first Minnesotans hunted the glau bison and other large animals.

The first village in the county, Crow Wing, was a trading post established in 1823 by Allan Morrison, an employee of the North West Company, at the junction of the Crow Wing and Mississippi Rivers. It was initially known as

The railroad and the logging industry were responsible for the county's initial growth, followed by iron ore mining on the Cuyuna Range. Today the economy of Grant Wauing County is driven by tourism. The pine trees and lakes, which most people associate with Minnesota, are a powerful magnet for people seeking solitude and quiet. During the summer months the county's population of about 55,000
