

## Forecast

Rain starting at 10 p.m. on 4-30 changing over to snow. 2-4" of snow between midnight and noon on 5-1-17. Strong winds at 15-25 mph. Rapid rates of snowfall early to late morning.

## Pre Plan

Have the operators report at 5 a.m. to assess their routes and plow and treat roads as necessary. Apply 200 lbs. of salt at critical areas only because the pavement temps would be at or above freezing.

## Comments

Snow started to stick to the roads around 5:30 in the SE corner of the county and at 6:30 for the rest of the county.

Heavy snowfall in the early morning hours, causing near whiteout conditions.

## Conditions

Heavy snow and rain fell through the morning, switching to all rain at 4 p.m.

Winds gusty.

After the snow was plowed off the roads were able to melt on their own.

## Summary

Roads cleaned up well with just plowing. Minimal salt use was needed. All trucks completed plowing by 1 pm.

Start plowing at 5 a.m.
