

### Summary

Roads cleaned up pretty well for how cold it was. Slow moving traffic areas including intersections is where we saw compaction. Roads not passing were due to the cold temperatures and the salt not working due to the temps.

### Decisions Made

We decided to start plowing at 5 a.m. to get on the roads towards the end of the event. 500 lbs. of 50/50 salt/sand mix worked well in most areas.

### Lessons Learned

Salt and sand mix worked marginally. The pavement temps did not allow the salt to penetrate much. Most roads opened up and had bare wheel paths from freeze drying. Most of the roads that didn't pass were due to slow moving traffic packing the snow down and at intersections and in 30 mph areas.
