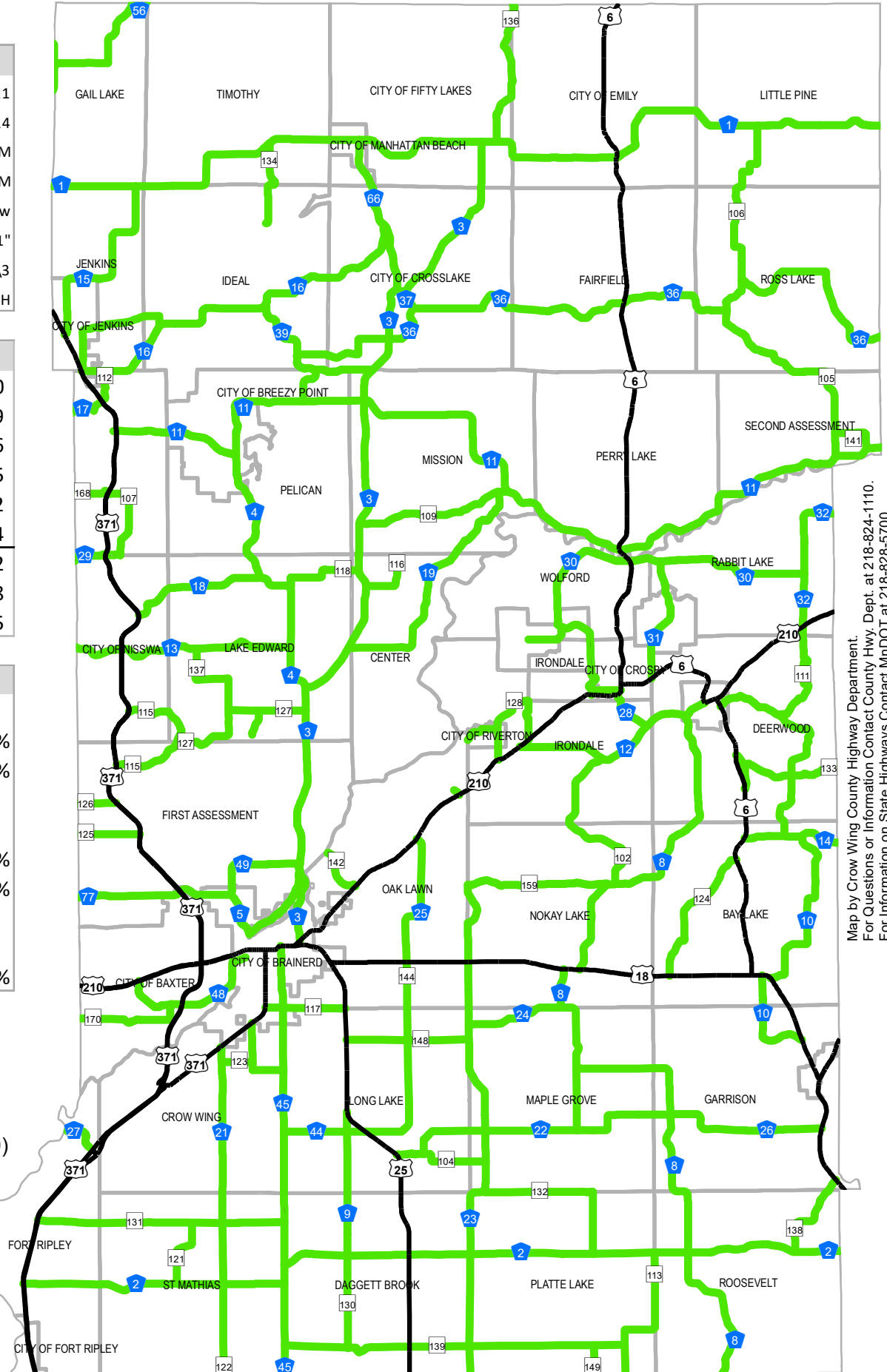

Forecast

Rain starting at 10:00 PM 2-3-21, changing over to snow at 2:00 AM 2-4-21. Temps around 32 and falling into the morning and throughout the day to below zero.

Pre Plan

Anti-ice major intersections on 2-3 to hopefully prevent ice bonding. Check roads in the early a.m. to see if rain started to freeze. Apply 300 lbs of salt to ensure full meting before temp drop below zero.

Actual Event

Event start: 2-4-21 12:00AM

Event ended 2-4-21 6:00AM

Comments

Trace rain fell overnight and began to freeze around 2:00 a.m. 2-4. Trucks were called out at 2:30 a.m. to start checking roads.

Conditions

Temperatures began falling early on 2-4 with a 10 mph NW wind. Some roads began to refreeze at day break and we encountered widespread patches of black ice.

Summary

Roads froze with the light rain but started to melt quickly with salt application at 300 lbs. Widespread refreezing around 7:00 AM 2-4-21 and trucks reran some roads and applied 150 lbs. of salt to drive lanes to help mitigate the refreezing, particularly in the passenger wheel paths. All roads had bare wheel paths by 9:00 AM, 2-4-21.

Decisions Made

Begin plowing at 2:30 AM. Apply 300 lbs. Recheck and apply 150 lbs. to fdrivelanes where needed due to refreeze.

Lessons Learned

Quickly dropping temps and moring rise in humidiy caused widespread intermittant refreezing in areas of the county. The 10 mph wind did not affect operations other than swift temperature drop. 300 lbs of treated salt application worked well but there wasn't enough liquid to keep it melting across the entire lane with the quickly falling temps.
