

# Technical Evaluation Panel (TEP)



TEPs provide forums to discuss site-specific interpretations of laws, rules, and technical data. They also provide an opportunity for gaining consensus on a number of primarily technical issues in order to make a recommendation to the Crow Wing County Board of Adjustment. The Crow Wing County Technical Evaluation Panel (TEP) consists of representatives from:

- Crow Wing County Environmental Services: **Dilan Christiansen**
- Crow Wing Soil and Water Conservation District (SWCD): **Jenny Sherren**
- Minnesota Board of Water and Soil Resources (BWSR): **Matt Johnson**
- Minnesota Department of Natural Resources (DNR is Shoreland only): **Jake Frie**
- U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (non-voting member): **Rob Maroney**

## Roles of the TEP

- Makes a recommendation on applications for non-exempt impacts to wetlands (should have a complete application, accurate delineation, and supporting information)
- Provides pre-application guidance for complex projects where further explanation is necessary
- Interprets the Minnesota Wetland Conservation Act (WCA), Clean Water Act, and other regulatory guidance material as it pertains to a specific project
- Conducts onsite reviews of difficult delineations in altered settings or problem areas and handles projects where contradicting delineations exist
- Provides/reviews wetland type determinations
- Looks at impacts or replacement in uncommon settings such as fens, bogs, rare species, etc.
- Works with local road authorities on wetland mitigation requirements for road projects
- Provides input on projects involving onsite mitigation and actions eligible for credit
- Makes exemption decisions that have a high chance of appeal or are controversial in nature
- Makes a ruling on whether “sequencing” has been met
- Handles large complex violations, or situations where legal action is likely
- Provides a pre-planning session prior to beginning development of a Comprehensive Wetland Management Plan
- Reviews wetland banking applications
- Processes requests for early withdrawal of mitigation sites from monitoring requirements
