Attached you will find the information requested for the annual checklist requirements along with other pertinent information for the Upper South Long Lake LID.

The Board of Directors for USLL LID during 2024-2025 consisted of eight members:

This season following the recommendation of the DNR and PLM, only one survey was conducted in June to identify the CLP beds and the EWM beds. Earlier in May chemical treatment of the same beds of CLP treated in 2024 were treated with a slight increase in the bed in the NE corner of the lake. Unfortunately, much more CLP acreage was discovered in the June survey. It is our hope that the DNR will allow treatment of all that (19.7 acres) in 2026. EWM seems to be slowly creeping northward in the lake, but all areas were small, and some past areas showed no EWM. All the EWM beds that were identified (9.7 acres) were treated. Total costs for survey, CLP, and EWM totaled \$24,237.60 this season. Following the EWM treatments six bright yellow milfoil buoys were placed to mark the beds and discourage watercraft activity in those areas. With the increase in our tax assessment the past few years our fund balance should be adequate to continue to aggressively treat any areas that the DNR allows.

In terms of other invasives: Zebra Mussels continue to be widespread and excessive; Spiny Waterflea testing was negative; and Starry Stonewort sampling has remained negative. Now that Starry Stonewort has been identified in more MN lakes it is important to be vigilant in our search and to continue to build a fund reserve for prompt treatment if found.

Again, Upper South Long applied for but did not receive a DNR grant. CWC, however, continued to provide grants of \$3500 for EWM treatment and \$200 for Starry Stonewort search.

The Board of Directors sought more nominees for the 2025-2027 term by posting a request in the Chatty Loon newsletter, on the USLL Facebook page, and through the lake's mass email list. This

resulted in a new willing member who was subsequently elected to the board at the July annual meeting. Her term began in August 2025. Unfortunately, one of our board members recently passed away. His position will not be filled until the July annual meeting since we still have eight active board members.

The Chatty Loon newsletter continues to be produced and posted on both the Upper South Long Facebook page and the lake association's website. Members are notified by the association's mass email when the publication is available. When the LID needs to inform members of issues, I post them to the Chatty Loon, the Facebook page, and the mass email. The ballot and the proposed budget, however, are mailed directly to LID members.

At our February board meeting it was decided to prepare an educational mailing (originally meant for new lakeshore owners but later decided to mail to all LID members) with a list of improvements that require permits (by either county or DNR), best shoreline practices, and a list of resources for lakeshore owners. The document is included in this annual report and was included in the mailing with the ballot and proposed budget to eliminate the cost of sending a second mailing.

In addition to that educational effort, two of our board members (Steve Bardolph & Al Steiff) finished replacing the educational signage around the lake at each road access point (six in all). The Upper South Long Lake Improvement Association reimbursed the LID for half of that expense. They also took responsibility to add meeting dates for association and LID meetings onto those signs as the dates draw near.

A majority of our LID board members along with representatives from the lake association met with representatives from SWCD after receiving the document "One Watershed, One Plan". Connie Theien will become our liaison to keep us informed. Board members continue to alert county environmental personnel to construction projects which appear to conflict ordinances and shoreline destruction projects on USLL shorelines in hopes that reparations will be made rather than fines or after-the-fact permits.

The LID Board continues to receive great support from the Upper South Long Lake Improvement Association's Board of Directors. Some of the tasks that they complete on our behalf include arranging and monitoring the public access inspections, sampling for Starry Stonewort and Spiny Waterfleas, training our newest board member to do the water sampling at the deep portion of the lake, and arranging and funding a free luncheon after the LID annual meeting.

On behalf of the LID Board of Directors and the residents of Upper South Long Lake, we want to thank the staff of Crow Wing County for the support and guidance provided.

The EWM we marked was not yet at its peak density and will likely increase in density if not managed, but we believe that this survey provided an accurate early assessment of EWM in the lake. These assessments of CLP and EWM will help guide management decisions for EWM in 2025, and for CLP in 2026.

Survey Method

CLP & EWM Delineation

Freshwater Scientific Services surveyed nearshore areas of Upper South Long Lake on June 11, 2025. During this survey, we navigated a meandering search path while using a combination of surface observations, sonar readings, and rake tosses to locate and delineate any areas of CLP or EWM growth. We used a hand-held Garmin GPS unit (GPS-MAP78) to record each of the locations where we encountered CLP or EWM, and also documented water depth and growth density (density rating: 1 to 3 scale as described below). The recorded water depths and plant densities were linked to the appropriate GPS locations and then mapped using desktop GIS software.

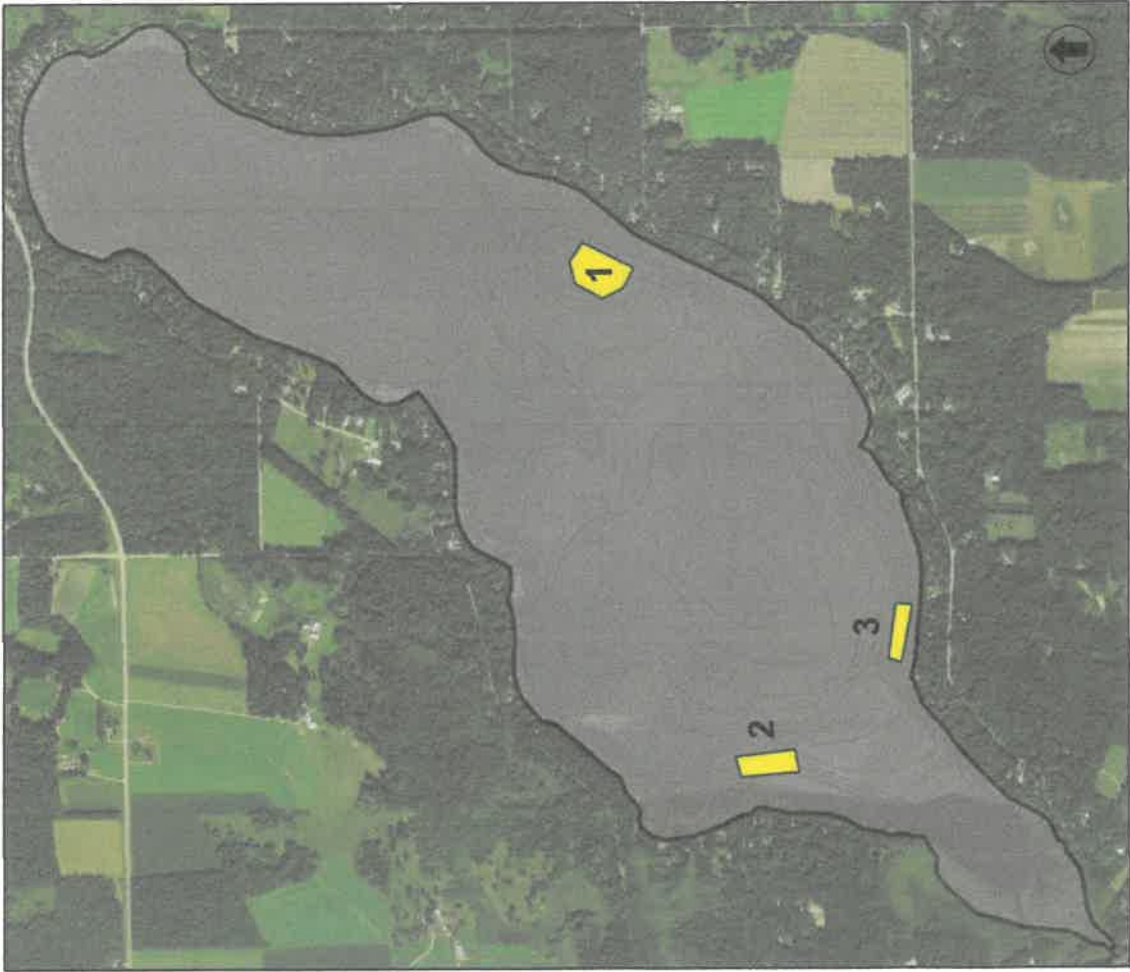



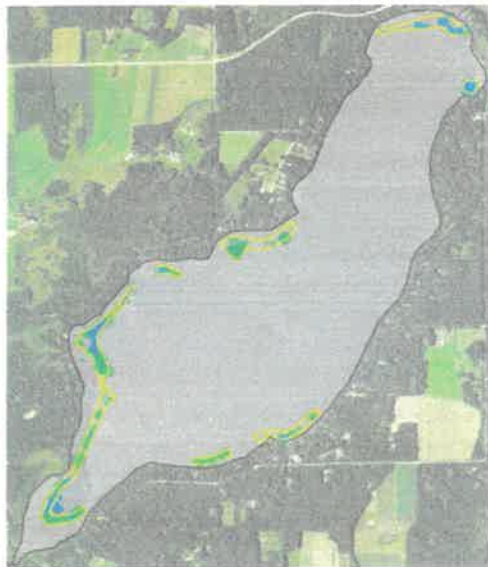

FUTURE PLANS for USLL LID 2025-2026

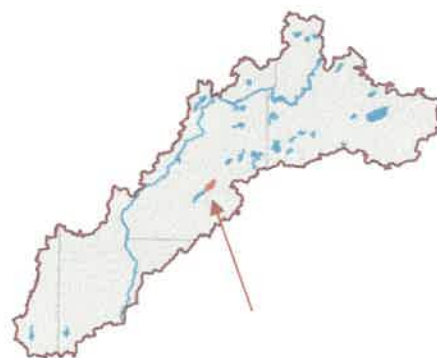
1. Contract in 2026 with Freshwater Scientific to survey the lake for the presence of Curlyleaf Pondweed and Eurasian Watermilfoil. (the full littoral zone) At the advice of the DNR and PLM only one survey was conducted in mid-late June to identify CLP beds for 2026 treatment and EWM beds for 2025 treatment. We may decide to return to doing separate surveys in 2026 after consultation with DNR, PLM, and Lower South Long Lake who tried this technique in 2024.
2. Contract with PLM to chemically treat CLP beds that were identified in a June 2025 survey (over 19 acres). This is a significant increase in the identified CLP in USLL.
3. Contract with PLM to chemically treat EWM beds as identified in a survey to be completed in 2026.
4. Continue to monitor the Zebra Mussel population and keep up to date with any possible current control methods. Apply to become a pilot site if that possibility arises.
5. Continue to test for the presence of Spiny Waterfleas and Starry Stonewort. Treat as aggressively as possible if their presence is discovered provided our funds allow.
6. Plan to do water quality testing at the main stream inlets and the outlet of the lake using AW Research. Testing should occur at least twice during the open water season. Testing frequency is dependent on water levels.
7. Continue monthly water testing at the deepest portion of the lake (chlorophyl a, total phosphorus, and secchi disk).
8. Mark EWM beds with bright yellow buoys in order to keep recreationists from spreading the invasive to other areas of the lake.
9. Continue to work jointly with the lake association to maintain and improve the health and stewardship of the lake. Assist, as needed, the non-board member volunteers who agreed to head up the Lake Steward program.
10. Brainstorm ideas to recruit more candidates for the Board of Directors. Several aging current board members are dealing with health issues. Attempt to get younger residents/owners involved.
11. Encourage board members to attend county and state meetings to advance their knowledge of invasives, best practices, latest research etc. Continue to forward any emails to the entire board when received from University of Minnesota, Crow Wing County, Lakes and Rivers group, etc.

Upper South Long Lake Implementation Plan



In 2022-2023, Aitkin, Crow Wing, Morrison, and Todd counties and SWCDs partnered to develop a One Watershed, One Plan for the Mississippi River - Brainerd Watershed. During the planning process, the committees established to develop the plan met with stakeholders, prioritized resource issues within the watershed, developed goals to address these issues, and identified pathways and programs to achieve these goals. The Mississippi River – Brainerd One Watershed, One Plan was approved by the state in January 2023.



In this series of Lake Implementation Plans, more specific implementation goals for lakes within the watershed were developed to facilitate outreach and projects.

Lakes within the Watershed have been identified as “Restore”, “Enhance”, or “Protect” depending on the current water quality status of the lake as listed below. This plan does not address Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS) because Counties already have their own AIS Plans.

This is Upper South Long Lake’s implementation plan. Upper South Long Lake was categorized as an “Enhance” lake during the watershed plan process, indicating a need to improve the current water quality in the lake through implementing Best Management Practices.

Management Focus



Restore

The lake is on the Impaired Waters List for excess nutrients.

Enhance

The lake has a declining water quality trend. Reduce phosphorus loading through stormwater and agricultural best management practices.

Protect

The lake has good water quality. Protect current water quality by protecting the surrounding land and implementing protective practices.

Why Does it Matter?

Property Values

What is your lake home worth?

Studies on Minnesota lakes show that lake property values are directly tied to water quality. For a three-foot decrease in water clarity, prices were reduced up to \$594 per shoreline foot. For a three-foot increase in clarity, prices increased up to \$423 per shoreline foot. This change in value can be a significant financial loss or gain to an individual property owner as well as a community.

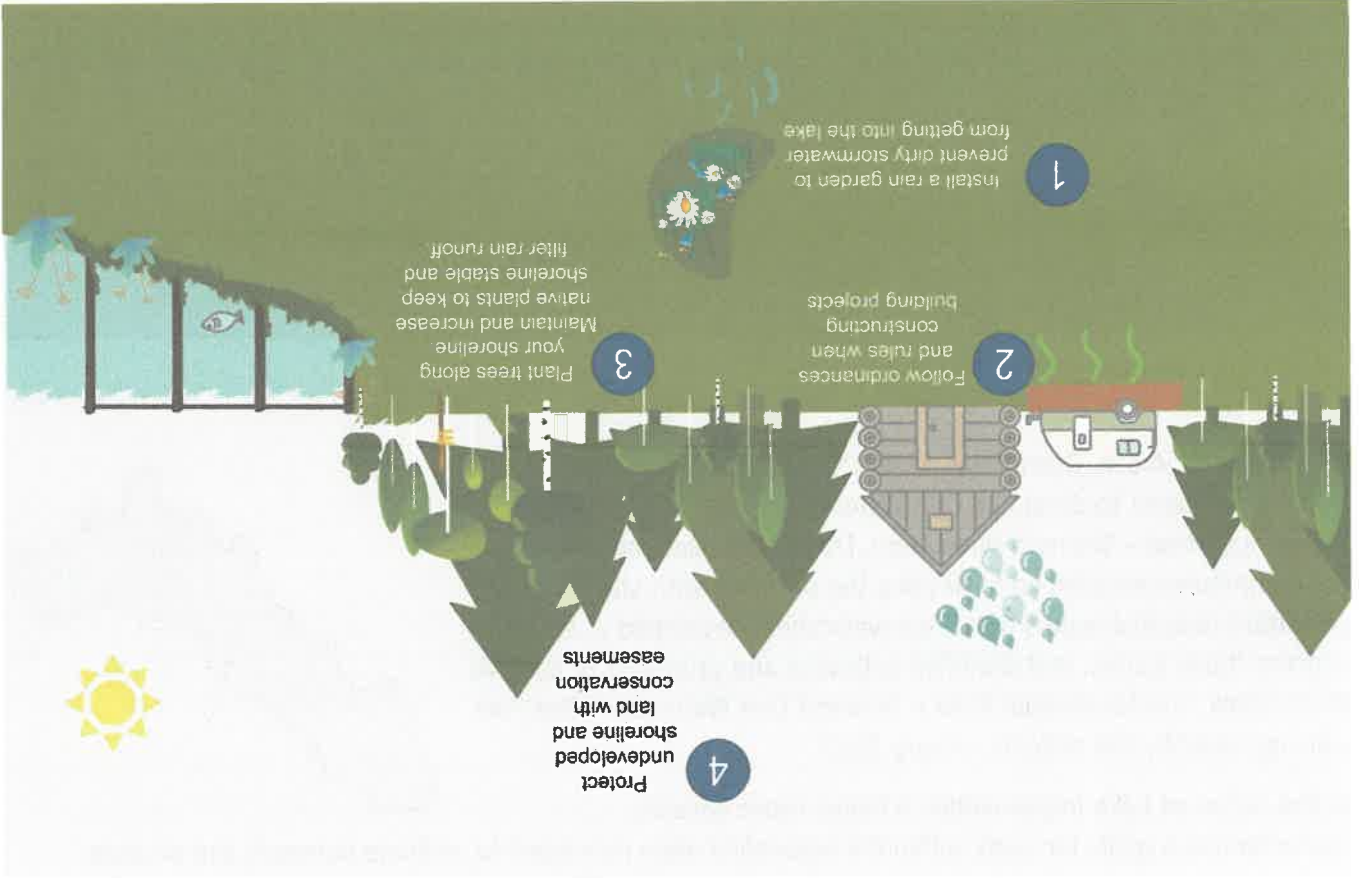
Fishing & Recreation

Do you enjoy fishing and swimming? Minnesota's native gamefish, such as walleyes, need clear water to see their prey, aquatic plants to hide and spawn in, and shade to keep cool. Keeping native plants in the lake and trees along the shoreline provide shade, spawning habitat, and protection for the game fish we love to catch. These plants and trees also help stop runoff and keep the lake clear for swimming and recreational activities.

Do you enjoy watching loons, bald eagles, turtles, butterflies, songbirds, and other wildlife at the lake? These animals depend on shoreline plants for nesting and cover, trees and forests for their homes, and native plants and flowers for pollinating. Keeping some of your yard natural enhances the habitat for these animals, ensuring their survival.

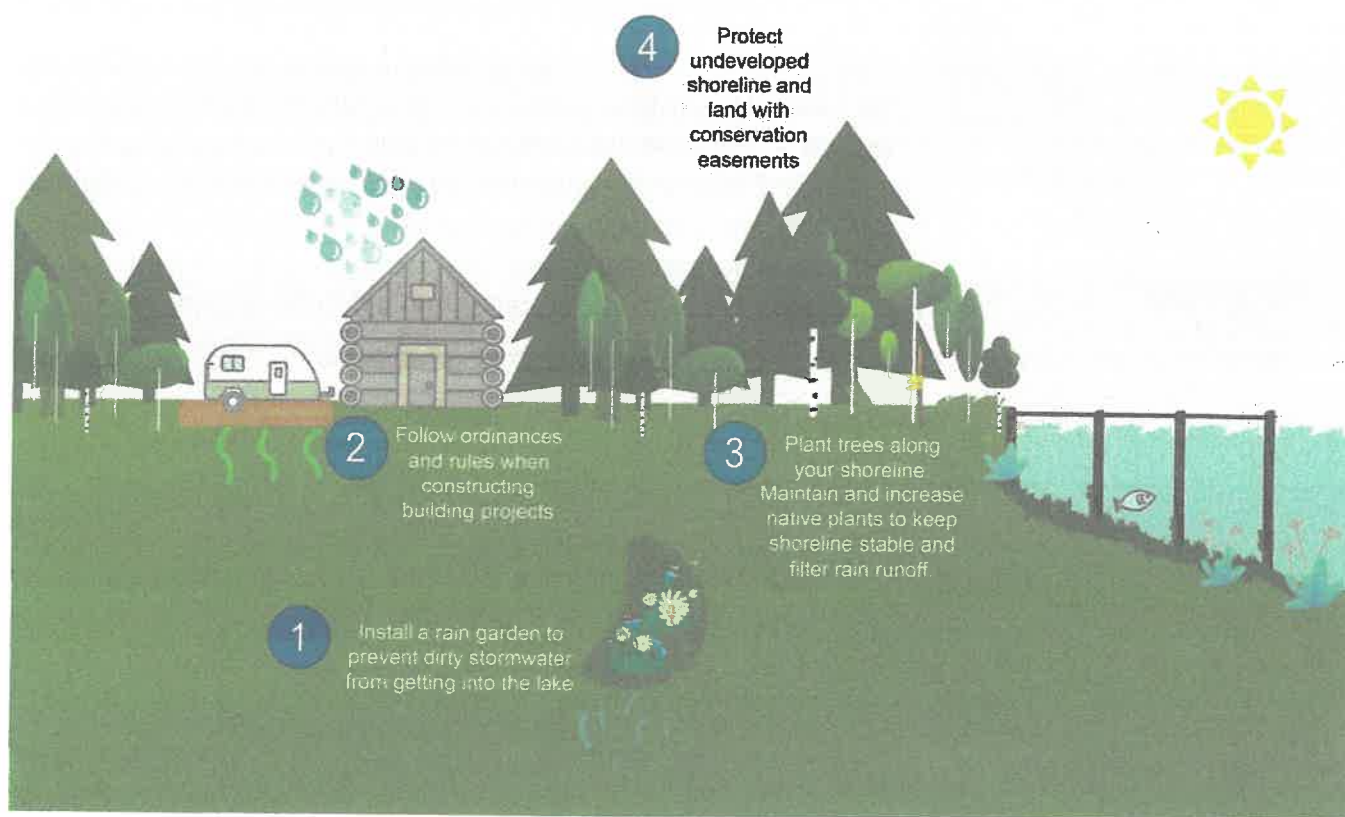

Plan Goals and Current Status

Phosphorus Loading

The long-term goal is to have 5% reduction in phosphorous loading into Upper South Long Lake by implementing best management practices.

- Phosphorus loading focus: **Watershed**
- Annual phosphorous load: **3,383 lbs**
- 10 Year Reduction goal: **10 lbs**

Shoreline Ordinances/Rules

There are rules in the watershed to follow when building within 1,000 feet of a General Development Lake:

- Minimum Building Setback: **75 feet**
- Maximum Impervious Surface: **Stormwater plan required if over 15%**
- Minimum Water Frontage Lot Width: **100 ft**
- Minimum Lot Area: **30,000 square feet**

3

Shoreline Restoration

Maintain and enhance riparian vegetation on shoreline with disturbed areas through outreach and collaboration with private landowners.

- 1 shoreline restoration project per year on Upper South Long Lake

4

Land Protection

Protect forest land habitat and improve water quality through increased land protection in the watershed (see Map 2).

- Long-term goal: **404 Acres**
- 10-year protection goal: **61 Acres**

The land ownership within the immediate drainage area around Upper South Long Lake is shown in the map below. Red areas are impervious surface, green areas are developed parcels, and tan areas are public or tribal lands. Projects will be targeted within developed parcels.

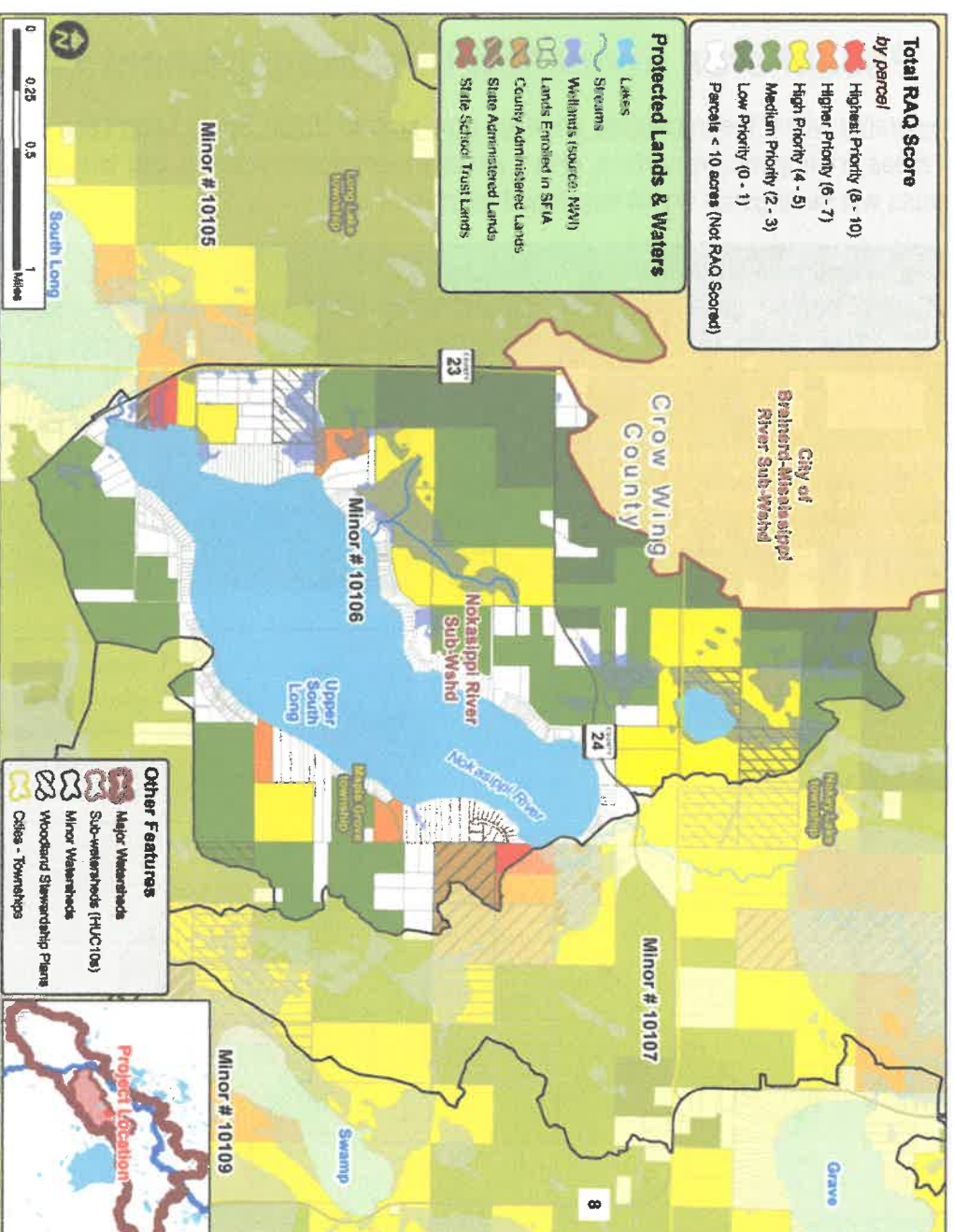
Prioritizing work on developed parcels with shoreland property has a large potential to reduce phosphorus to the lake, helping to improve water quality. The table on the previous page lays out details about which projects will be focused on shoreland parcels around Upper South Long Lake. These include:

- Stormwater management, i.e. raingardens
- Following ordinances and rules during building construction
- Shoreline restoration projects focused on native plants





Map 2. Land Protection Priorities



The map to the left can help identify areas with high land protection priorities. Each parcel is given a RAQ score, which prioritizes the land for its proximity to water bodies (Riparian) and public lands (Adjacency), as well as the resources present on the land (Quality), such as high biodiversity, wild rice, trout streams, etc.

Areas in orange are the highest priority for permanent protection such as conservation easements or Sustainable Forest Incentive Act (SFIA) covenants in this area, and projects on these lands could generate the greatest improvement in water quality. Please contact the Crow Wing SWCD for land protection options.
