

Forecast as of 3 pm on Sunday was for 1-3 inches of snow ending around 5 am with falling temperatures through the day.

Pre Plan

Staff plan was to begin snow plowing and deicing at 5 am based on the forecast. 400#/ lane mile was to be applied at this time.

Actual Event

Event start: 11:00 PM

Event ended 5:30 AM

Details/Comments

Manager/Supervisors began monitoring highways at 3 am and decided based on air temps to reduce salt to 200#/ lane mile.

Conditions

32 degrees at 3:30 am with snow falling. County and State highways were slushy with snow in spots

Summary

Staff began at 5 am applying salt at 200#/ lane mile due to warm enough temps and scraping down to bare pavement.

Decisions Made

During the event we noticed changing conditions and increased our salt usage to 300# around 7:15 am due to a 6 degree fall in temperatures. By 8 am we increased again to 400#. This seemed to be the best poundage

Lessons Learned

By the time the plowing and deicing was completed for the day we had a temperature decrease by 12 degrees. By having the supervisors and manager out on the roads they were able to make these decisions on the fly to
